THOMAS LIPSCOMB I. Possible son of William and Mary (Swan)
Lipscomb (See p.18)

THOMAS LIPSCOMB, as pointed out on page 9, could very well have been a son of William Lipscomb (I) and his wife Mary Swan. And, lacking any other, even barely, possible parentage in the early Lipscomb family, let us consider his story in this branch.

The Thomas Swan will (p.20,-Swan Excursus) named only one son, William, as an heir to William and Mary (Swan) Lipscomb, in 1704, -- so, if Thomas (very probably named for Thomas Swan as a grandfather) could have been a second son, he would have surely been born after 1704, -- maybe as early as 1705. Although his dates have been widely published as 1700-1770, the birth date has never been validated with proof.

Great problems have been created about his parentage because of a long-standing family tradition among those descendants of Thomas Lipscomb I who went into the Carolinas soon after the Revolutionary War. For some meason they have maintained a colorful hypothesis that Thomas was a son of a Joel Lipscomb, who, as a Wiltshire follower of the Duke of Monmouth, was forced to flee England after the latter's defeat and beheading in 1685. And, that he had settled in Virginia about 1690, etc. etc. etc.

The source or proof of this theory has not been found anyplace. And, eleven years of searching through Virginia Archives and resources have produced no possible Joel Lipscomb of that period. (Nor, from incomplete search of records in Wiltshire). There WAS a later Joel Lipscomb, son of Thomas Lipscomb II, son of Thomas Lipscomb I, —in other words, he was a grandson of the Thomas Lipscomb under consideration. (See Introduction, p. iii)

If this Thomas Lipscomb had been a son of this so-called "Immigrant Joel Lipscomb", then, he and his descendants do not belong in this book, — because this book is about the descendants of Ambrose Lipscomb I, who bought land in 1681, in what is now King William County, Virginia, (then, New Kent Co.).

Further, let us quote from one of the published accounts, -"Lins-comb Genealogy", -(2 vols.)- James Wilkes Lipscomb, 1959. p.2,--

"So far as the records (what records?) show, Joel Lipscomb was the only one of the name who made his escape to America, and any one of the name in the United States is presumed to descend from him. This means all Lipscombs are related."

Now, since, --

1. No possible tangible evidence has been produced to support the "Joel theory", and

2. Thomas Lipscomb's wife has been generally accepted by all, though not proven, to have been Sarah MackGehee, daughter of Thomas MackGehee whose will dated 1724 (p.12) named his daughter, Sarah, and who lived within about three miles from the William Lipscomb land patent of 1703-- on land he (Thos. MackGehee) had patented 1702, and

Thomas Lipscomb I and his wife, Sarah, named their only sons, "William," "Thomas", and Wohn" (William and John for probably his father and for his brother), then,

can we accept the most likely fact that Thomas Iirscomb I had come

from the Ambrose Lipscomb I ancestry? And, proceed to outline his descendants (in part)?

Let us consider that Thomas Lipscomb I, possible son of William Lipscomb I and his wife, Mary (Swan) Lipscomb, was born ca. 1705 in King William County, Va. and married, ca. 1730, Sarah MackGehee (b. ca,?1709), daughter of Thos. MackGehee of King William Co.. Some question how Sarah, sister of Dinah MackGehee who had married John Lipscomb (uncle to our Thomas) could have married the nephew, Thomas Lipscomb.

Peferring to p. 22, we note that Thomas MackGehee's will of 1727 named, in the early nart. John Lipscomb, his son-in-law"and my daughter, Dinah, his wife". -- then, in a later portion, among his 9 children, he named a daughter. Sarah. who was under 21, and judged, by some, to have been even a daughter of Thomas' possible second wife, hence considerably younger. To, John, a younger brother of William (sons of Ambrose I) could well have, before 1727, married the older sister of Sarah who later married the son of William.

It would seem that Thomas and Sarah left King William Co. soon after marriage. Their first son, William, born according to descendants' records, 28 March 1731. - wouldn't it be in either Ying William Co. or in Hanover Co?

Thomas patented land in Hanover Co., 11 Apr. 1732 (Pat.B.14 pp.402-3), for 15 shillings. 132 acres on both sides of Great Rocky Creek, adjoining Ambrose Joshua Smith. It was listed as "unto Thomas Lipscomb of the County of Hanover", - so, he may have already become established there by Apr.1732. Had Thomas and his wife gone to the western part of Hanover Co. (which in 1742 became Louisa Co.), perhaps with her brothers, William, -- and Samuel Mack-Gehee? (Patent - See pp 345/346)

Hanover County Court records were burned- so no records there exist for our Thomas Linscomb I. Only a few Louisa Co. Court records refer to him. in the abstracted Deed Bks.A.B.C.C.D. & D. (1742-1774), by Rosalie E. Davis,--

- 8 Apr.1765 (Louisa Co. D.B.C., p.77) Thomas Lipscomb received 1387 acres, adjoining Paulett, Johnson and Morris, from his son, Milliam Lipscomb, who had bought 2789 acres for 1425 on Duckinghole Cr. 6 Oct. 1763. St. Martin's Parish.
- 15 Oct. 1765 (Louisa C. D.B.C. 140-2) Thomas Lipscomb bought 6 acres. b 3, from Thos. Paulett and wife, Eliz., on Goldmine Cr.

Then he was around 50 years of age, Thomas apparently went into a bit of speculative land dealing. Lunenburg Co. Va. records show that 4 Aug.1752, Thomas Lipscomb of St. Martin's Parish, Louisa Co. bought from Sam'l Comer of Cumberland Parish. 400 acres on both sides of Twitty Creek, in Lunenburg Co. (Lun. D.B.3 pp 44-6). And. 15 Dec.1758, (Pat.B.33 p.519) Thomas Lipscomb was granted 1025 acres, both sides Twitty Creek, in Lunenburg Co.. for \$3-5-0.

Disposal of the 400 acres has not been found. But, the Land Grant proved a good investment -- because he conveyed to John Pettus of Charlotte Co., for 165-0-0,513 acres of that tract, recorded 24 Apr.1769 (Char.Co.D.n.2 p. 202, -- and, to Drury Yeoman of Charlotte Co., for 1170-0-0. the remaining 512 acres. (Charlotte Co. from Lunenburg. 1764).

The 1769 St. Martin's Parish, Louisa Co. tithe list, cuoted in Wa. Genealowist", Vol. 20 #1 p.48 (from records preserved in the Swem Library at College of William and Mary), shows Thomas Linscomb with 9 titheables and 1006 acres.

Executors: sons.

William and Thomas

Witnesses: Wm. Pettus

James Smith

John Smith

Wm (X) Davis

The o titheables, of course, included the adult male slaves.

Thomas Lipscomb I dated his will 3 Oct. 1770 Louisa Co., Va. and he must have died very soon after, because the will was probated 12 Nov. 1770. (W.B.2 p.84)

His will was the conventional type, leaving to--

His wife (no name), during her widowhood, 5 negroes (named)

Son John, - 500 acres on Goldmine Cr.

Remaining land on Goldmine Cr. to be sold and money distibuted.
To wife, Tract "whereon I now live", for her lifetime, then to be sold.

To daughters--

Mary Wash, 1 negro, Charles.
Susanna Ragland, 1 negro, Daniel.
Sarah Pettus, 1 negro, Abram.
Betty Smith, 1 negro, Caito.
Anna Sims, 1 negro, Dinah.
Annes Davis, 1 negro, Molly, and ±30.

Agnes Ragland, 1 negro, Amey.

Elizabeth and Salley Hall, his grandchildren, one equal child's part of his Estate. (Daughters of a deceased daughter of his).

Rest and remainder of Estate, Real and Personal, "lent to my Beloved Wife" for her lifetime, then to be sold and money divided.

It has been assumed by some that since John was named first, that he was probably the eldest son. However, since William and Thomas were named Executors, with no specific legacies, isn't it fair to surmise that they were the oldest sons, and that they had no doubt received their portions as they matured, as was often the case? And, that John was enough younger that he may not have even been married yet? (instead of the estimated birth in 1728).

From the will, and other sources, we can list the children of Thomas and Sarah (MackGehee) Lipscomb, -- (Last page of Will- see p. 340)

Descendants of THOMAS LIPSCOMB I, and his wife, SARAH (MACKGEHEE) LIPSCOMB (See p. 207)

Let us, now, consider the descendants of the many children of Thomas Lipscomb I ("1700-1770"), and his wife Sarah (MackGehee) Lipscomb. We'll begin with the apparently oldest son, William ("Sr"), who went with his parents to what later became Louisa Co., Va., and married Elizabeth Smith.

WILLIAM LIPSCOMB, Sr., son of Thomas and Sarah (MackGehee) lipscomb, perhaps the eldest son, was born, according to branch family records,

1752, in Va., Elizabeth Smith (b. 12 Sept.1735; d. 10 Sept.1820, Spartansburg
Dist., S.C.) daughter of David and Elizabeth Smith.

They lived in Louisa Co., Va. during the Revolutionary War. He was a member of the Committee of Safety, Louisa Co., appointed 19 May, 1775. In addition he is credited for Public Service, -- (all DAR acceptance)

Wm Lipscomb, Louisa Co. Court Booklet, n.4,6,10; Certificates 4; Lists I, p.3,5,15 and II p.4,6; Commissioners Book III, p.357, 359.

"410 lbs.of bacon at 10 p. per lb.; for 50 lbs beef at 4 p.; for 9 days service as collector to the 7th district at 5 p. per day; for 425 lbs. beef; for furnishing Dragoons with 60 ? ±4-10 (?); for 14 bu. Corn, for 50 lbs. fodder, 600 bundles fodder, etc.etc.

William Lipscomb had bought land, 254 acres from John Pettus in 1758, land which he sold, 9 Feb. 1763 to Mm. Blackwell for £180. (D.B.C p. 203). Deed witnessed by Joseph Bickley, Obediah Harms, & Griffith Dickinson.

6 Oct.1763, he bought 2789 acres, £425, on Duckinghole Cr. (1st Cr. east of Goldmine Cr.) from John Syme of Hanover Co. Not bad at age 32! From this tract, he conveyed to his father, Thomas Lipscomb I, of St. Martin's Parish, 1387 acres in Trinity Parish; William and his wife, Elizabeth indicated as "of Trinity Parish". (Louisa Go. D.B.C. p.71-3). Date 8 Apr.1765, price £212.

After that date, there are a number of deeds in smaller portions, from 1766 through 1772. and, as Executor along with his brother. Thomas, of their father's estate, they sold, 8 Apr., 1771, from that estate 445 acres to Thos. Paulett. and 335 acres to The Paulett. (Iouisa Co. D.B.D. pp. 280-282)

By 1784, William, after being a planter and owning all that land in Louisa Co. Va., took part of his family, along with two nephews, Joel and Nathan (sons of his brother, Thomas, who had moved to Spotsylvania Co.), and started out for Georgia. This is recorded in "History of Spartansburg, S. Carolina" p.371, saying that they decided, along the way, to stop and settle in South Carolina, on the Big Thicketty (near the present city of Gaffney). The nephews, Joel and Nathan, settled in the Abbeville District.

Villiam Libscomb Sr.'s will dated 7 (or 17) July 1808, Spartanburg District, South Carolina was proven 4 Apr.1810, and recorded 7 Nov.1810. Spartansburg District. S.C. 4 copy of his will is also recorded in Jill B.A.p.577, Madi-

son Co., Ky., no doubt because of the inheritance of his son, Nathan, who had gone to that area in Kentucky. From William Sr.'s will, we learn the names of his dildren, - all born Louisa Co., children of his wife, Elizabeth (Smith) Lipscomb, who died 10 Sept. 1820, ---

You will find, in pages following, many branches carried down from the five sons, -William, David, John, Nathan and Smith. - material furnished generously by Cathrine Cleek Mann (Mrs. Robert Neville), whose husband descended from the William Lipscomb, son of Thomas Lipscomb II, (See p. 312). She is a professional genealogist, and has done much research in these branches of the Lipscomb family. * The two daughters, too, - Mary and Ann Elizabeth.

He married, 18 Oct.1759, Mary Smith (h.14 Dec.1733,-d.1 Jan.1817), daughter of David Smith, and his wife, Elizabeth (Ragland?) Smith, if, that is, she was, as supposed, the sister of Elizabeth Smith who married William, the brother of Thos., her husband.

Louisa Co. was taken from Hanover Co. in 1742, and Albemarle Co. was taken from Louisa and Goochland Counties in 1744. Thomas and Mary may have spent some time in Albemarle Co., indicated by the deed, 6 Nov.1769 to Thomas Lipscomb "of Albemarle Co.", from James and Jemima Chiles of Spotsylvania Co. for 244 acres in Spotsylvania Co.. Albemarle Co. records have not been checked-but there seem to be no significant records in Louisa Co. for this Thomas Lipscomb.

So, it would seem that Thomas and his young family moved to Spotsylvania Co. around 1769. Thomas Lipscomb, then, bought, 21 Oct.1773, from Clayton Coleman and his wife, Mary, for £205, 670 acres on the branch of the East Northeast River, in Spotsylvania Co. On 16 Aug.1781, Thomas and Mary sold to Francis King of Md., 400 acres in Spotsylvania Co. for £4000 (must be a mistake?), and again, in 6 Jan.1795, sold to Francis King 100 acres. £74-10-0 In 4 Apr.1796, Thomas bought from Am. Winslow and Peggy, his wife, of Berkely Parish. Spotsylvania Co., 305 acres, \$1680. And, 21 Nov.1796, Thomas and Mary sold to Allen Billingsly of Md., for £275, 695 acres in Spotsylvania Co.. These are their land transactions up to 1800.

These above deed records are taken from Wm.A. Crozier's "Virginia County Records, Spotsylvania Co. 1721-1800". There are a number of other records of Thomas Lipscomb as witness to documents, and two especially, deeds of gift-

20 Oct.1791 - Thomas Linscomb and Benjamin Waller, Jr. of Spotsylvania County to Granville Valler - 2 negroes. (Granville was their mutual grandson)

29 Mar. 1793 - Thomas Lipscomb to his son, Joel, of Edgefield Co., S.C.,

2 negroes. (recorded 3 Sept.1793.

During the Revolutionary War, Thomas Lipscomb, of Spotsylvania furnished supplies. (DAR acceptance) --

Spotsylvania Co. Court Booklet p.2; which says-- 1781
9 July to Thos Lipscomb ye 24 Sept. for 500 lbs. beef at 20- 14-3-1

One reference has been found for a possible military service, in "The Genealogical Dept., DAR Magazine, 1947-50" - Esker, p.523, reporting "The Militia of Spotsylvania County, Virginia, as evidenced by petitions of 14 November 1776" in which the members of the Militia asked that the place for Muster be made closer to the center of the County instead of at Fredericksburg,
at the one side of the County. Thos. Lipscomb's name is on the Petition #1,
that of Capt. Craig's Company.

No further reference to his service in the County Militia has been found. Many descendants have made the error of calling this Thomas Linscomb Thomas Linscomb, Ensign! This confusion has been a natural one, because, in the Linscomb family, there are so many of the same given name. However, it will be good to have this problem clarified. Please refer to p. 259 in the segment on the real Ensign Thomas Linscomb who lived in King

William Co., with many records for proof, - son of Anderson Lipscomb, and a brother of Capt. Bernard Lipscomb. Let's, please, not have any further confusion. Thomas Lipscomb of Spotsylvania, husband of Mary Smith, was not the Ensign. Burgess "Va. Soldiers of 1776" p.769, etc. has them confused!

Thomas and Mary Lipscomb's names are on the earliest list of the Roll of Wallers Baptist Church, in Spotsylvania Co.-From the Minute Book 1799-1818.

(The Virginia Baptist Historical Society, U. of Richmond, Richmond Va. 23173.)

Land Tax records were checked beginning with 1804, Spotsylvania Co., and Thomas paid tax on 407 acres, on the Plentiful River, 16 miles West of the Court House up through 1817. He is likewise listed on Personal Property Tax lists, with usually 8 to 10 slaves.

Thomas Lipscomb's wife, Mary, died 4 Jan. 1817, and it is understood that Thomas lived with his son, John, in Spots. Co. until John's death, in 1824, with - son, David, where he died 12 June 1825, back in Louisa Co.

The Virginia State Archives, Richmond, have a typed copy of the family records which were started in the family Bible by Thomas Lipscomb II, of Spotsylvania (1737-1825). It is seemingly the earliest actual family Bible record in family lore, and the it is only a copy, it is very valuable as a source for much data that would most ordinarily have been lost. It does contain the death date of Thomas, and goes on for many years including data on many of his descendants. Where the actual Bible is now is unknown, but we are fortunate to have photocopies of the handwritten copy of the letter written in 1881, in which his grandson, Thomas Lipscomb (b. 1803), son of David Lipscomb, sent his copies from the actual records to his sister, who had gone to Kentucky. The letter began,—

" Heard Co. (Georgia) 21st Dec. 1881

G. Willis Lindsay and Elizabeth Lindsay.

Dear Nephew and Sister- Your letter of 10th inst. has been received and I have in an imperfect manner tried to comply with your request to copy my grandfather and your grandfather's family record which I have done in pencil mark which you can transcribe

..... (Signed) Thomas Lipscomb", and

attached were four pages of handwritten copies of the Bible data.

"Sister" Elizabeth (see p. 277) had gone to Kentucky around 1820 with her husband, Dr. Lunsford Lindsay, and had evidently written to her brother Thomas, who had meantime gone to Heard Co., Georgia (see p. 282), and who had the family Bible in his possession, to ask for this family information.

We are most fortunate that Malvina ("Mallie") Lindsay (1861-1946- see p. 280) granddaughter of Elizabeth, and niece of G. Willis Lindsay, had made a copy of all this material. And, we are grateful, too, to Lorene Englert (p.279) a dedicated sleuth, for tracking down this "Mallie's copy of the Bible record" among her papers.

(It is most unfortunate that the typed copy in the Virginia State Archives bears, at the top of page 1, the erroneous notation indicating that that Thomas Lipscomb (1737-1825) was "The Ensign Thomas who was not only ensign but also lieutenant & Captain". That was an easy assumption to make, but the mistaken identity is explained in pages 237 and 238). (VSA Accessions file #23801)

Cathrine Cleek Mann (Mrs. Robert Neville, p. 312) has graciously furnished her copy of the Bible records (next page) which she secured, 1954, from another source. This copy compares accurately with the handwritten copy of Mallie's with the exception of four minor details,— the handwritten copy shows,—

Elizabeth (Lipscomb) Waller died aged 26 yrs. 9 months (not 8)
Mary Chiles died 24th of May... instead of 1-24-1839
Samuel Harris Lipscomb died 6th of July 1796 .. instead of 7-16
Thomas Lipscomb was born 11th of Jan. ..instead of 1-1, 1803. (under "David Lipscomb's Family Record")

Then, in addition to all the data quoted on next page, there were a few family groups, and dates, including, -- (all children of David (1769-50))

Mary N. Lindsay who married Wm. W. Hillman, included in segment, p. 277-8

Mary Lipscomb who m. John T. Chiles, included in segment, p. 283

Nathan Lipscomb, with list of his children, included p. 281-2

And, his own (Thomas') list of children, included p. 282-3.

Here, we have the copy of the "Heard Co., Ga. Lipscomb Family Bible record," as furnished by Cathrine Cleek Mann, widow of Robt. N. Mann (See p. 212) (See notes on previous page)

The following record was copied from Manuscript L638 of The Institute of American Genealogy, 407 South Dearborn Street, Chicago, Illinois, on 31 Mar. 1954 by Cathrine Cleek Mann. The records of the Institute were purchased by the Genealogical Book Company of Baltimore, Maryland, and sold in the 1960's.

JOEL LIPSCOMB was born in Virginia, possibly in Louisa County, Aug. 25, 1760 and died in Greene Co., Ala. Sept. 4, 1836. Though some accounts refer to him as born in Spotsylvania, he was over 9 when his father first bought land there. Joel married Aug. 26, 1779 Elizabeth Chiles, b. Ap. 20, 1760, d. Nov. 15, 1847 in Marengo Co., Ala. (1) She was the daughter of William Chiles and Agnes White of Spotsylvania, as shown by a deed of gift of Oct. 18, 1781: "Thomas White of Spotsylvania County to my granddaughter

Betty Lipscomb, daughter of William Chiles by my daughter Agness. Slave. Said Betty and her husband Joel Lipscomb."(2)
No record of military service has been found for Joel; at some time during the revolution he was in Louisa County, perhaps to live or work with relatives. On Ap. 15, 1782, Joel and William Lipscomb appeared in Louisa County Court to testify that "seven beaves the property of the said Joel imprized ... for the use of the army June 17, 1781 weighed 2325 pds. "Joel was allowed 3d per pd. (3)

Within the decade after the Revolution, a group of Virginia families, connected by blood or marriage, migrated to Western South South Carolina. Joel was in this migration, settling in the 96th District. He appears in the 1790 census of this District, Edgefield County with 1 male over 16,2 under 16,3 females and 7 slaves. The record of Joel's first land acquisition has not been found, though he sold land in Edgefield Co. to Abraham Crews on August 3,1797, with Betsey Lipscomb, wife of Joel, signing her right and claim of dower. (4) On Dec. 5,1814, Joel received a grant of 554 acres in Abbeville District, S.C. (5) On Mar. 29,1793, Joel's father gave him 2 slaves:

"Thomas Lipscomb of Spotsylvania County to his son Joel Lipscomb of Edgefield County South Carolina. Deed of

Lipscomb of Edgefield County, South Carolina. Deed of gift. 2 negroes. "(6)

By 1800 Joel appears in the census of Abbeville District, S.C. with a family of 5 males and 5 females; he is listed in the census of this District in 1810 and 1820, and in Greene Co., Ala. in 1830.

Joel was a Baptist, and in 1802 was a "messenger" from Coronaca Baptist Church to the Association. (7) In September 1809. Joel and Elizabeth Lipscomb joined Siloam Baptist Church by letter. Joel soon being elected a Deacon. (8)

Several of Joel's children had migrated in the early 1800s to the section of the Mississippi Territory that later fell in Alabama. On Ap.19,1823 Joel wrote his son Nathan in Alabama expressing his desire to move there:

"We should be glad to see you and familey but cannot come unless I can sell my land. Your mother wishes to see you all and is very anxious to move to that country."(9)

"In Church Conference our beloved brother and sister Joel and Elizabeth Lipscomb and brother Thomas Chiles expecting to go in a short time to the Alabama State made application for letters."(10)

Alabama Land Patents, 1818-1832 show Joel acquiring land on Dec. 2,1823 in Greene Co.(11) He settled here in a community called "Hollow Square", where he died and was buried at Bethel Baptist Church, now in Hale County. His will (12) Ap. 30, 1834-Nov. 14, 1836 names wife Betsy, sons Nathan, Abner S., William C., Elihu, Dabney and Joel and daughters Polly Eddins, Betsy Weir, and the children of Sally Parrott, dec'd. After Joel's death, Betsy went to live in Columbus, Miss., where she had a son, Dabney, and daughter Betsy Wier, later returning to end her days at the home of her son Nathan in Marengo Co., Ala. Mary Wier, writing to her cousin Dorothy Lipscomb on Feb. 22, 1840 states:

"Grandma had become very much dissatisfied and was very impatient to go to your house before Uncle came. I hope

she will be better pleased there."

Betsy was buried beside Joel; Bethel Church is gone, but the stones remain:

"Sacred to the memory of Joel Lipscomb a native of Virginia who departed this life September 4 1836 aged 76 years and 9 days"

"Sacred to the memory of Betsey Chiles, wife of Joel Lipscomb who departed this life November 15,1847 aged 87 years 6 months and 5 days" (13)

NATHAN LIPSCOMB, son of Joel and Elizabeth Lipscomb, 260 was born in Virginia (14) Aug. 18,1782 (15), possibly in Spotsylvania County, and died in Marengo County, Alabama Feb. 4, 1862. He m. 1 in Abbeville District, S.C. Aug. 28, 1805 Lucy Meriwether, b.Aug.1788, d.Jl.23,1807, daughter of Nicholas Meriwether and Sarah Ragland Michie, widow. Nathan m. 2 in Abbeville Feb. 4,1808 Elizabeth Meriwether Douglass, b.S.C. Nov. 27, 1788, d. Marengo Je. 2, 1853, daughter of John Meriwether and Esther McGehee and widow of Hugh Douglass. The wives were first cousins. (16) Nathan migrated to the Mississippi Territory ca.1816-17, settling in Clarke County, adjacent to Washington County where Abner Smith Lipscomb was practicing law at St. Stephens. This section was soon to become the Alabama Territory and then the State of Alabama. A letter exists, headed Abbeville District, S.C., Jul. 14, 1818, to Mrs Elizabeth Lipscomb, Alabama Territory, Clarke County, Bashi Creek. Here Nathan established a sawmill. "The first mill on Bashi was built by Nathan Lipscomb a short distance below the Choctaw Corner". (17) By 1819, Nathan had acquired land in Marengo County. (18) A few years later he built a home here between the French settlement at Demopolis and the village of Jefferson.

Nathan was a planter; a Baptist, he was a member of Mt.Pleasant Church at Jefferson and a charter member of Fellowship Church

near Demopolis.

The will of Nathan Lipscomb, Aug. 24.1854-Mar. 1862 (19) devises to son Samuel's children, sons Lee, Milliam, Joseph Edwin, Nathan Zachary and daughters Lucy Simmons, Esther Hallum and Elizabeth Stewart. Nathan and Elizabeth and a number of Descendants are buried in the cemetery Nathan requested his executors "lay off for the connections". (20)

ABNER SMITH LIPSCOMB, Son of Joel Lipscomb(p.241)

263 ABNER SMITH LIPSCOMB, son of Joel and Elizabeth Lipscomb, was born in Edgefield Co., S.C. Feb. 10, 1789 and died in Austin, Texas while serving on the State Supreme Court Dec.8, 1856: "Judge Lipscomb, a distinguished jurist and one of the Associate Justices of the Supreme Court of Texas was attacked some ten days since with a combination of typhoid fever and pneumonia, of which he died Sunday night, December ?.at the boarding house of Mrs. George. He was buried beside his old friend, Gen. Edward Burleson on Monday afternoon at five o'clock." (41) Abner had studied law in S.C. in the office of John C. Calhoun, and was admitted to the bar in 1811. (42) On Ap. 10, 1811, he and 2 companions from Abbeville, S.C. received a passport from the Governor of Georgia "to travel the Creek Nation of Indians". (43) He appears in the Washington Co., Mississippi Territory, census of 1816, this area later falling in the Territory and then the State of Alabama. He established a law practice here at St. Stephens.

Abner Smith married here on Ap.13,1813 Elizabeth Gaines,b.Ja. 6,1799.dau of Young Gaines and Esther Lawrence.Young Gaines will (44) devises to wife Esther and son, George D., Dau. Ann Gaines "near Demopolis" (she was the wife of Gen. George 3. Gaines (45)), and to dau. Elizabeth G. Lipscomb, Elsie (sic) M. Lipscomb, William B. Lipscomb, son of Abner S. Lipscomb and

Young Gaines Lipscomb.

Abner Smith was a member of the Alabama Ferritorial and State Legislatures, and a judge of the State Supreme Court. He moved to Mobile, Ala. to practice law and engage in extensive land speculation. In 1839, he moved to Washington Co., Texas, where Elizabeth Lipscomb died in 1841. On May 10, 1843. Abner married Mary P. Hunt Bullock, b. N. C. Oct. 5, 1806, d. Washington Co. Sept. 22, 1876, dau. of Thomas Hunt and Elizabeth Duke and widow of Richard Bullock. Esther Hallum of Independence, Tex., writing to her sister, Dorothy Elizabeth Stewart, on Oct. 14, 1876 states:

"Our old Aunt Polly Lipscomb died about 3 weeks ago. She had been sick about 3 weeks before she died, from what I can learn general debility and old age carried her off. She was a good woman and devoted Christian, beloved

and respected by all who knew her ..."

The public career of Abner Smith Lipscomb is summed up by the epitaph on his tombstone in the State Cemetery, Austin, Texas:

"Judge Abner S.Lipscomb - Born in South Carolina February 10,1789 - Died Dec.8,1856 - Member of Legislature, Alabama, 1818 - Associate Justice Supreme Court, Ala. 1820-1835 - Secretary of State, Republic of Texas 1841 - District attorney 1844-45 - Associate Justice, Supreme Court of Texas 1846-1856 - Lipscomb County was named in his honor "

The will (46) of Abner Smith Lipscomb, Oct. 2, 1856-Ja. 6, 1857 devises to wife, Mary P. 266 ELIHU HERNDON SMITH LIPSCOMB, Son of Joel (p.241)

ELIHU HERNDON SMITH LIPSCOMB, son of Joel and Eliza-266 beth Lipscomb, (85) was born in 3.C. ca.1795-1800 and died in Harrison Co., Texas, May 2,1847, where his estate was administered May 17,1847 by Joel Lipscomb, Jr., who states his brother Elihu "died two weeks hence", and in a later paper gives the above death date. (86) Elihu married in South Carolina ca. 1821 Harriet Lilly, daughter of David Lilly, Baptist minister, who died in Abbeville District in November, 1807, leaving sons Edmond B. and John A. and daughters Harriet W. and Julia A. Lilly. (87) William Chiles, uncle of Elihu Lipscomb, was guardian of these two daughters. (88) The estate of Edmond B. Lilly shows payment to Elihu Lipscomb on Feb 25, 1822 "in behalf of his wife, formerly H.W.Lilly". (89) Some accounts have given as wife a Miss Estrange. However, when Joel Lipscomb, Jr. on May 10,1839 gave his niece, Mary Elizabeth Lipscomb, a slave, he refers to her as daughter of Elihu and Harriet W.Lipscomb. (90) Letters of Mary Elizabeth to her cousin, Dorothy Elizabeth Stewart, refer to her aunt Julia Eskridge and her sons; evidently, Julia Lilly had married an Eskridge (various misspellings include Estradge) and this had mistakenly resulted in giving Elihu an Estrange wife. Elihu obtained land in Marengo Co., Ala. in 1822 (91) and in 1830 appeared in the census of that county with 2 males under 5,1 male 5-10,1 male 10-15,1 male 20-30,1 male 30-40 and 1 female, 25-30. There were apparently others in the household beside Elihu's immediate family. On Sept. 30,1831, Elihu sold his Marengo County Land Patent #1371 to Gottlieb Breitling. (92) He subsequently appears in Caddo Parish, La. and Panola and Harrison counties. Texas. In Jan. 1838, Elihu bought a lot in Shreveport, La., which he sold the following year, at that time being "of Caddo Parish". (93) In Dec., 1840, he hired his daughter's slave, appearing in this transaction as "Elihu Harden" and "Elihu Hurndon" Smith Linscomb, (94) of Harrison County. He sold several parcels of his Harrison County Headright land in 'eb., 1842, being then "of Panola County" (95)

267 ELIZABETH (BETSY) LIPSCOMB, Daughter of Joel (p.241)

ELIZABETH (BETSY) LIPSCOMB was born in Abbeville District, S.C.May 5,1798 and died in Enterprise, Clarke Co., Miss Mar.10,1864 (97) during the time of the Civil War when Union troops were occupying the area; the circumstances of her death are related in the following letter, dated Mar.12, 1864, headed "In camp near Demopolis" and directed to "Mrs Stewart" - Dorothy Elizabeth Lipscomb Stewart, who lived in the vicinity of Demopolis:

Dear Madam:

Knowing you are very anxious to hear from your aunt in Enterprise, I take this opportunity of making the following statement and I do so with genuine sorrow. Brother Heme, a classmate of Dr. Thomas Wier, saw Dr. Wier several days ago. As I told you, the Dr. had gone after the body of a Colonel (an intimate friend). He was on his way back with the body when communication was cut off; he had the body buried near Columbus and came to this place. From here he went to Mobile and learning there that he could get to Enterprise, he did so. He then telegraphed to his brother at this place that their mother was not expected to recover from a stroke of paralysis. Heme also learned that they took from your aunt one negro man and her two mules. They were going to take everything, but Miss Ellen demanded a guard and thus saved everything else. I am sorry to be the bearer of such unfavorable news, but I know you are anxious to hear. In Sister Wier I ever found a true and generous friend, but if the Lord sees fit to remove her from this world of tumult and commotion, His will, not mine, be done ... with profound respect,

Elizabeth Lipscomb married in Abbeville May 12,1818 illiam Mier, b. County Tyrone, Ireland, Je. 5, 1792, son of Thomas Wier and Mary ithrow, who had landed in Charleston, S.C. on St. Patrick's Day, 1795, later moving to Abbeville District. (98) William and Elizabeth moved to Alabama and then to Mississippi. He was a Methodist minister, serving the Alabama Conference from 1831 till his death.de served Puscaloosa Station, Greene (Co.) Circuit, Gainesville and Columbus Districts and in 1852 was appointed financial agent of Macon 'emale College. He died in Columbus, Miss. Sept. 19, 1853, and is buried there in Friendship Cemetery. (99) His will (100) of Sept. 9,1853 mentions daughters Mary Elizabeth, Susan Jane, Ellen L., and sons "illiam "., Thomas Coke, James Benson, Dabney 3., the last named "to have a collegiate education provided he conducts himself properly and is economical ... his expenses until his entrance in college not to exceed for schooling and clothing \$100 per annum". He desires the estate not to be divided until the minor children are educated or at the death of his wife.

DABNEY LIPSCOMB, (105) son of Joel and Elizabeth Lipscomb, was born in Abbeville District, S.C.May 6,1803, and died in Columbus, Lowndes Co., Miss. Je. 22,1850; he m. probably in Alabama, Oct. 25,1826 Jane E. Hardwicke, b. Ga. May 13,1810, d. Columbus Sept. 28,1865. Dabney was a physician, educated at Columbia College, Washington, D.C. under the guardianship of John C. Calhoun, and at Transylvania College, Ky. He appears in the 1830 census of Tuscaloosa Co., Ala., and in 1832 moved to Columbus. He was a State Senator and President of the Mississippi Senate. His will (106) of Ap. 7,1850 mentions minor children, his son

William Lowndes "to have a horse saddle and bridle, my shop of medicine and shop furniture ... my medical books ... I expect Wm. Lowndes to furnish the family with all the medicines they may need except some of the more costly, viz., quinine ... 269 JOEL LIPSCOMB, JR., Son of Joel (p.241)

JOEL LIPSCOMB, JR. was evidently the youngest child of Joel and Elizabeth Lipscomb, being still a schoolboy in April of 1823 when his father wrote Nathan Lipscomb "I had entered Joel and Samuel to learn the English grammar... they are tolerable well through the arithmetick". (Samuel was Samuel Ragland Lipscomb, who had remained in S.C. with his grandparents.) Joel Jr. accompanied his parents to Greene Co., Ala., and appears here at the sale of his father's estate Fe.27,1837. He married in Greene Jennet Robinson, dau. of George Robinson and Mary Herndon, license dated May 16,1838. Accounts giving Joel as wife a Hallum cannot be verified, and may result from confusion with his nephew, Joel Lipscomb Hallum. Joel Jr. lived or owned land in several adjacent Parishes and Counties in Texas and Louisiana. (109)

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He was of Caddo Parish, La. in 1839 when he gave his niece a slave; (110) of Panola Co., Tex. in 1842; (111) of Harrison Co., Tex., when he sold land there in 1846. (112) After this, he seems to have lived some years in Bossier Parish, La., selling his farm and appurtenances there in 1849 - a sale later cancelled to his brother-in-law Williamson Wynne of Greene Co., Ala, who had married Helen Mary Robinson, sister of Jennet Lipscomb. (113) At New Orleans on Ap.8, 1857, Joel Lipscomb, now of Platte Co., Missouri, appointed an attorney to sell his Bossier Parish land; it was sold Ap. 24, 1857. (114) In 1860, Joel appears in Platte Co. without wife or child. The only known child of Joel and Jennet Lipscomb was:

JENNET LIPSCOMB b. Texas, 1845; in 1850 she was in the home of her uncle Williamson Wynne in Greene Co., Ala. No further record.

The following letter was written by Joel Lipscomb.Jr., from J.C. to his son Nathan in Alabama:

April the 19 1823

Dear Jon, I imbrace the chance by your uncle Thos. Chiles to inform you that through mercy we injoy our health at this time hoping these lines will find you and familey injoying the same blesing. We have nothing strange to relate but the death of your cousin Thomas Lipscomb about the first of feby. and several others have died about Cambridge in the course of the winter. Mr. Nicholas Meriwethers familey was very sickly last faul and himself has a very bad rising on his back but is thought to be on the mend. We received your letter by Mr. Parrot and were sorry to hear of your famileys suffering so much sickness but glad to hear of their recovery. Mr. Parrot has moved to Greenville Court house he and his familey had been sickly where they were. Dabney appears well pleased with his change.

I have wrote to Abner to let you have 200 dollars of the money that I put in his hands to buy land with as I am hard run for money and could not nelp you nor him without declineing getting land untill I come which I cannot do without selling my land here (which is dull chance as times is so hard) and if I should sell I can buy for myself. I have made very short crops the two last years, not corn enough to do my familey and 20 bales cotton and that from 8 to 10 or 10 0 1/2 Our prospect for wheat is more promising and we have just finished planting our cotton about 50 acres and the season appears to commence favorable. April the 30th ___ your uncle has not started as he expected and all still well. I had not closed this letter untill now as he is to set out on Monday next if not before, if Abner has laid out my money in land you will have to wait untill he can sell some or take some of the land. I had entered Joel and Sumuel to learn the English grammar. They were progressing very

well but the man has quit the school and I have not a chance of a horse to spare yet to ride to another school at the and do not know yet what to do. They are tolerable well through the arithmetick. We should be glad to see you and family but cannot come unless I can sell my land, your mother wishes to see you all and is very anxious to move to that country. I cannot close this letter without calling on you to remember from whence you have all the blesings of life and what poore helpless beings we are and I beg of you & Betsey to think what profissions you have made and what will be your fate without humbling yourselves and asking pardon and forgivenefs of him who is all ways more ready to forgive than we are to ask. The Lord is doing wonders at the north and amongst the heathen in turning siners from their sins to serve the living God. We cannot change our hearts but we can refrain from sining and God has promised he will be with them that have respect to his law to bless them and that he will pour his vengeance on all who sit light by his commandments - be faithful, examin your case, you must ere long give account how you have lived, let these thoughts rest on your minds and may the love of God constrain you to consider your latter end and final judgment from whence there is no escape. Think on these things and they shall make you neither barren nor unfruitful. The things of this world are a blesing when ritely · used but a snare when otherwise. From your affectionate father.

David was born 17 Feb. 1769 and died 26 May 1850. He left a will, probated in Louisa, Co. June 1850. His home was on Duckinghole Creek in Louisa Co., not far from the Spotsylvania Co. line. On 17 May 1792 he married Martha (Patsy) Day in Louisa Co. She was born 25 April 1766 and died 20 February 1842. To this union were born eight children. David married a second time, Lucy P. Brown, on 6 October 1842. No issue.
